



PEDIATRIC BILL OF RIGHTS

The following excerpt is taken from the Association for the Care of Children's Health, "A Pediatric Bill of Rights". In this surgery center, you and your family have the right to:

- Respect and personal dignity.
- Care that supports you and your family.
- Information that you can understand.
- Quality health care.
- Emotional support.
- Care that respects a child's need to grow, play and learn.
- As much privacy as can be provided to allow you and your family time alone.

FOR THE CHILD

We will tell you who we are and what our role in your healthcare is.

We will provide a place for one family member to stay as close to you as possible at all times.

Your family can stay together as much as possible. If this is not possible, the people caring for you will explain why.

We will explain all the things to you and speak in language you can understand. You can ask at any time what is happening to you and why.

You can make choices whenever possible. Please ask questions about anything that is unclear to you or your family.

Let us know what play and learning activities you like to do to help you grow and learn while being a patient in our facility.
