Wound Care:    Ice the operative site for 20 minutes out of every hour while awake for the next 3 days. Place ice bag around ankle or behind the knee. To prevent frostbite use a cloth barrier between the skin and ice.    Keep dressing clean, dry and intact						
feel tired or drowsy the day after surgery. You may also experience mild headaches, muscle aches, sore throat or slight nausea after surgery. These symptoms should resolve in a day or two.  You may not drive for 24 hours after anesthesia, any time you are taking narcotic pain medications, while on crutches or wearing a post-op cast or boot. You should not operate machinery or make important decisions during this time.
